**QUESTION 1**

You work as a Graphics Designer for KBC Inc. You are preparing a document for printing in InDesign CS5.

Which of the following options in the Mark and Bleed pane of the Print dialog box specifies how far from the edge of the page will InDesign draw printer's marks?

- A. Offset
- B. Crop Marks
- C. Weight
- D. Bleed Marks

Correct Answer: A

The Offset option in the Mark and Bleed pane of the Print dialog box specifies how far from the edge of the page (not the bleed) will InDesign draw printer's marks.

Answer: C is incorrect. It displays the possible weights of the crop and bleed mark lines.

Answer: D is incorrect. It adds fine (hairline) rules that define the amount of additional area to image outside the defined page size.

Answer: B is incorrect. It adds fine (hairline) horizontal and vertical rules that define where the page should be trimmed. Crop marks can also help register (align) one color separation to another.

QUESTION 2

What does the More Options button change to when it is clicked?

- A. Facing Pages option
- B. No More Options
- C. Master Text Frame option
- D. Fewer Options

Correct Answer: D

Following are the steps to create a new document:

1. Choose the sequence File>New>Document or press CTRL+N.
2. Choose Print or Web in the Internet pop-up menu according to the type of document to be created.
3. Type the number in the Number of Pages field, if the number of pages in the publication is exactly known.
4. Enter the number in the Start Page # field on which the document is to be started, if it is other than 1.
5. If a multipage publication having a spine, such as a book, catalog, or magazine is to be created, then select the



Facing Pages option.

6. Select the Master Text Frame option, if the text needs to flow from page to page in a multipage document, such as a book or a catalog.

7. One of the pre-defined sizes from the pop-up menu can be chosen in the Page Size area.

8. Click the Potrait or Landscape iconic button to set the page orientation.

9. To specify the number of columns in pages, type a value in the Columns field.

10. In the Gutter field, specify a gutter distance.

11. In the Margins area, specify margin values.

12. The Bleed and Slug area of the New Document dialog box will appear on clicking More Options, and the More Options button will be changed to Fewer Options.

13. To close the New Document dialog box, click the OK button.

QUESTION 3

You have created a table which is long enough to flow over two pages of your document.

What will you do to duplicate the data in the first row on the second page?

A. Select the rows and Choose Table > Convert Rows > To Body.

B. Choose Table > Table Options > Headers

C. Insert your cursor in the first row of the table and select all data; then press the Tab key

D. Insert your cursor in the first row of the table and choose Table > Convert Rows > To Header

Correct Answer: D

InDesign provides header rows as a feature that automatically repeats the necessary rows whenever the table splits across columns, frames, or pages. Therefore, to duplicate the data in the first row on the second page, insert your cursor in the first row of the table and choose Table > Convert Rows > To Header.

QUESTION 4

How will you reposition a page in the center of the document window?

A. Choose View > Fit Spread In Window

B. Choose View > Entire Pasteboard

C. Choose View > Actual Size

D. Choose View > Fit Page In Window

Correct Answer: D



You should choose View > Fit Page In Window, to reposition the page in the center of the document windows, if it is not already centered.

Answer: A is incorrect. The Fit Spread In Window option displays the targeted spread in the Window.

Answer: C is incorrect. The Actual Size option displays the document at 100%.

Answer: B is incorrect. The Entire Pasteboard option displays the full pasteboard.

QUESTION 5

For which of the following types of documents is PDF used? Each correct answer represents a complete solution. Choose all that apply.

- A. Network-based
- B. Web-based
- C. PDF-bsaed
- D. CD-based

Correct Answer: ABD

Following are included in the graphics file formats InDesign imports:

- 1.BMP. It is the native Windows bitmap format.
- 2.EPS. EPS or Encapsulated PostScript file format is favored by professional publishers. One of its color-separated variant is DCS or Desktop Color Separation.
- 3.GIF. GIF or Graphics Interchange Format is common in Web documents.
- 4.Illustrator. It is similar to EPS.
- 5.InDesign. Other InDesign documents can be imported, as if they are graphics. Specific pages can also be chosen to be imported.
- 6.JPEG. JPEG or Joint Photographic Expert Group compresses bitmap format used on the Web.
- 7.PCX. PCX or PC Paintbrush was very popular in earlier versions of Windows and DOS programs. It has been supplanted by other formats.
- 8.PDF. PDF or Portable Document Format is a variant of PostScript and is used for Web-based, network-based, and CD-based documents.
- 9.Photoshop. Photoshop is the native format in Adobe Photoshop 5.0 through CS5.
- 10.PICT. PICT or Picture is used in professional documents.
- 11.PNG. PNG or Portable Network Graphics is more capable than GIF.
- 12.Scitex CT. It is the continuous-tone bitmap format used on Scitex prepress systems.
- 13.TIFF. TIFF or Tagged Image File Format is the bitmap standard for image editors and publishers.



14.Windows Metafile. Windows Metafile is used in professional documents.
