Correct Answer: D

The client acceptor daemon serves as an external timer for the scheduler. When the scheduler is started, it queries the server for the next scheduled event. The event is either executed immediately or the scheduler exits. The client acceptor daemon restarts the scheduler when it is time to execute the scheduled event.

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**QUESTION 2**

IBM Tivoli Monitoring for IBM Tivoli Storage Manager (TSM) includes which three components?

- A. IBM DB2
- B. TSM Proxy Agent
- C. TSM Collection Agent
- D. Tivoli Data Warehouse

Correct Answer: DEF

Tivoli Monitoring consists of a number of components that accumulate and monitor historical data for reporting: / IBM Tivoli Enterprise Portal / IBM Tivoli Enterprise Management Server / Tivoli Data Warehouse

IBM Tivoli Monitoring consists of Hub Tivoli Enterprise Monitoring Server (hTEMS), Remote TEMS (rTEMS), Tivoli Enterprise Portal Server (TEMS) and Tivoli Data Warehouse (DW).

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**QUESTION 3**

Which two statements describe the process of collocation?

- A. Placing IBM Tivoli Storage Manager (TSM) database volumes in the same directories.
- B. Isolating archive and backup data to separate storage pools.
- C. Combining multiple TSM servers onto a single physical server.



- D. Isolating a client or group of clients to their own volumes within a storage pool.
- E. Isolating a single or group of filespaces to their own volumes within a storage pool.

Correct Answer: DE

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When collocation is by client node Volume selection order: 1st: A volume that already contains files from the same client node

When collocation is by file space Volume selection order: 1st: A volume that already contains files from the same file space of that client node

Note: With collocation enabled, the server attempts to keep files belonging to a group of client nodes, a single client node, or client file space on a minimal number of sequential-access storage volumes. Collocation reduces the number of volume mounts required when users restore, retrieve, or recall a large number of files from the storage pool. Collocation thus reduces the amount of time required for these operations.

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#### QUESTION 4

What does the message ANR\*\*\*W format indicate?

- A. This is a client warning message.
- B. This is an informational message.
- C. This message was posted Wednesday.
- D. This is a Tivoli Storage Manager server warning message

Correct Answer: D

Server ANR messages list. Examples:

ANR0107W: Source file(line number): Transaction transaction ID was not committed due to an internal error.

ANR0115W: The server script script name attempted to start more parallel commands than are allowed for a single script. A single script is limited to parallel command limit parallel commands. ANR0116W: The server script script name attempted to start more parallel commands than are allowed for the server. The server is limited to parallel command limit parallel commands.

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#### QUESTION 5

What is the purpose of the VirtualNodename option?

- A. To restore or retrieve files from UNIX to Windows.
- B. To restore or retrieve files from another workstation.



- C. To transfer the IBM Tivoli Storage Manager (TSM) backup/restore client node password information to a system.
- D. To automatically allocate the same amount of space on the target TSM backup/restore client.

Correct Answer: B

The virtualnodename option specifies the node name of your workstation when you want to restore or retrieve files to a different workstation.

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
