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QUESTION 1

You are caring for a child with epiglottitis. On assessment of the child what would indicate to you that the child is experiencing airway obstruction?

- A. The child is leaning backwards and supporting himself with his hands and arms.
- B. The child has a low-grade fever and complains of a sore throat.
- C. The child is leaning forward with the chin thrust out.
- D. The child exhibits nasal flaring and bradycardia.

Correct Answer: C

If a child is leaning forward with the chin thrust out, this is an indication that the airway may be obstructed. Other indications might include nasal flaring, tachycardia, high fever and sore throat. To prevent spasm of the epiglottitis and airway obstruction, no attempt should be made to visualize the pharynx.

QUESTION 2

If your patient was taking clozapine (Clozaril), what laboratory result would you want to monitor for adverse effects?

- A. White blood cell count
- B. Platelet count
- C. Blood glucose
- D. Liver function studies

Correct Answer: A

The nurse would want to monitor the patient\\'s white blood cell count while they are taking this medication. This medication commonly causes agranulocytosis. Treatment would be interrupted if the white blood cell count drops below 3000 cells/mm. Agranulocytosis could become fatal if not detected.

QUESTION 3

What type of eye drops would be ordered for the patient who is being prepared for cataract surgery?

- A. Osmotic diuretic
- B. Miotic agent
- C. Mydriatic medication
- D. Thiazide diuretic

Correct Answer: C



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A mydriatic medication would be ordered for the patient who is being prepared for cataract surgery. This will produce

QUESTION 4

Which of the following orders would the physician prescribe for the patient with retinal detachment?

mydriasis and dilation of the pupil. It will also constrict blood vessels.

- A. Bathroom privileges
- B. Head of bed up 45 degrees
- C. Eye patch to affected eye
- D. Dark glasses to read or watch television

Correct Answer: C

The physician would order an eye patch to the affected eye. This decreases movement of the eye and prevents further damage to the eye. The physician may limit activity until the eye can be repaired.

QUESTION 5

Which of the following assessments by the nurse would indicate a possible manifestation of dementia?

- A. Presence of personal hygienic care
- B. Improvement in sleeping
- C. Absence of sundown syndrome
- D. Confabulation

Correct Answer: D

Confabulation is when a patient fabricates events or experiences to fill in the gaps in memory. This is common with dementia patients. Dementia varies from the development of mild cognitive symptoms to more severe alterations in neurological functions. These more severe alterations can become life-threatening.

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
