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#### **QUESTION 1**

Where would you locate the annular ligament?

Correct Answer: D

Explanation: The annular ligament stabilizes the proximal radius against the ulna during pronation and supination of the wrist. The ligament is located deep to the supinator and origin of the extensor muscles of the forearm near the head and proximal shaft of the radius at the elbow.

#### **QUESTION 2**

Which of the following muscle groupings are considered phasic muscles?

A. Triceps brachii, deltoid

B. Temporalis, masseter

C. Quadratus lumborum, cervical erector spinae

D. Gastrocnemius, soleus

Correct Answer: A

Explanation: Phasic muscles are fast twitch muscles and are best suited for quick movements. The triceps brachii and deltoid muscles are typically used for movements and do not have a postural role. They are also prone to inhibition as well as fatigue.

#### **QUESTION 3**

Correct Answer: C
Explanation: Phantom pain is a phenomenon where a person experiences sensations of a limb or body part after it has been amputated. Phantom sensations have also occurred in people with removed organs and after a mastectomy.

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
