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#### **QUESTION 2**

You have a Microsoft Exchange Online tenant that contains a user named User1.

User1 needs to be able to search mailboxes and purge email.

To which role group should you add User1?

- A. eDiscovery Manager

Correct Answer: B

To delete messages, you have to be a member of the Organization Management role group or be assigned the Search And Purge role in the compliance center.

#### Incorrect:

Not A: To create and run a Content search, you have to be a member of the eDiscovery Manager role group or be assigned the Compliance Search role in the Microsoft 365 compliance center.

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## **QUESTION 5**

You have a Microsoft 365 tenant that contains a user named User1.

Automatic email forwarding to mailboxes outside your company is blocked for the tenant.

You need to ensure that User1 can automatically forward email to an external recipient.

What should you do?

- A. Create an anti-phishing policy.
- B. Create an anti-spam policy.
- C. Modify the Tenant Allow/Block List.
- D. Create an anti-malware policy.

Correct Answer: B

The new method of blocking AutoForwarding is managed in Threat Management policies instead of Exchange transport rules. It is well hidden with a relatively new default policy called Outbound spam filter policy.

If you do have a need for email to be automatically forwarded from internal to an external destination, then a custom policy must be created to allow any exceptions.

You need to create the custom Outbound Spam policy.
