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QUESTION 1

- A sinus tachycardia is a physiological response to pain.

Treating the cause of the increased pulse rate requires pain medication.

QUESTION 2

The LPN is receiving the report on a comatose patient at the start of the shift at 1500.

What statement should be of most concern?

- A. The patient was bathed and skin was assessed head-to-toe at 0900 with no abnormal findings.
- B. The patient\\'s indwelling urinary catheter was last changed 5 days ago.
- C. The patient was repositioned on his right side at 1100.
- D. The patient\\'s PEG tube was changed 6 months ago.

Correct Answer: C

QUESTION 3

Alcohol, caffeine, or drugs are high risk factors that all fall under which broad classification of risk factors?

- A. Social demographic
- B. Environmental
- C. Biophysical
- D. Psychosocial
- Correct Answer: D

Psychosocial risk factors include life style choices like the use or abuse of alcohol, caffeine and illicit drugs

in addition to smoking and psychological status.

Low income, age, and ethnicity are social demographic risk factors.

Second hand smoke and air pollution are environmental risk factors; and biophysical risk factors include

genetic considerations, nutritional status and disorders such as diabetes.

QUESTION 4

A nurse is assessing a patient\\'s right lower extremity. The extremity is warm to touch, red and swollen. The patient is also running a low fever.

Which of the following conditions would be the most likely cause of the patient\\'s condition?

- A. Herpes
- B. Scleroderma
- C. Dermatitis
- D. Cellulitis
- Correct Answer: D

Inflammation of cellular tissue associated with a fever most likely indicates cellulitis.

QUESTION 5

The LPN is receiving report on a newly admitted 14-year-old boy. He is described as being very bright and a good communicator, but his social interactions seem a bit "off." He spends much of his time playing with his baseball card collection, which he has organized in a meticulous fashion.

Given this information, which diagnosis does the nurse suspect the patient may have?

- A. autism spectrum disorder
- B. Asperger\\'s syndrome
- C. ADHD
- D. Rett syndrome

Correct Answer: A

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
