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### QUESTION 1

What should be done by the EU member states and is not a responsibility of the supervisory authorities?

- A. Impose administrative fines to controllers
- B. Make rules for penalizing other GDPR infringements

Correct Answer: B

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### QUESTION 2

What is the main reason for performing data protection by design (from conception)?

- A. Develop technical measures for the protection of personal data.
- B. Enable better marketing campaigns targeted at customers.
- C. Collect as much data as possible for data processing.
- D. Reduce the risk of not meeting legal obligations.

Correct Answer: D

When we talk about protection by design, we are considering data protection throughout the data lifecycle, from collection, processing, sharing, storage and deletion.

When we focus on protecting data at all of these stages, the risk of not meeting any legal obligations is significantly reduced.

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### QUESTION 3

Which of the alternatives describes one of the Supervisory Authority's responsibilities?

- A. Supervise the processing of data of holders residing in a country belonging to the European Economic Area (EEA).
- B. Consider the nature of the treatment, and as far as possible, assist the controller in order to enable the controller to fulfill his obligation.
- C. Provide the controller with all necessary information to demonstrate compliance with obligations.
- D. Apply technical and organizational measures to ensure that only personal data that are necessary for each specific purpose of processing are processed.

Correct Answer: A

The correct option is the responsibility of the Supervisory Authority, the others are the responsibility of the processor.

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GDPR Article 3 decrees:

This Regulation applies to the processing of personal data of data subjects who are in the Union by a controller or processor not established in the Union, where the processing activities are related to:

- a) the offering of goods or services, irrespective of whether a payment of the data subject is required, to such data subjects in the Union; or;
  - b) the monitoring of their behaviour as far as their behaviour takes place within the Union.
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#### QUESTION 4

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is often known as the "European privacy law". What is the relationship between `privacy` and `data protection`?

- A. Privacy is a part of data protection that aims to keep personal data confidential.
- B. Data protection is a part of privacy that aims to keep personal data confidential.

Correct Answer: D

Data protection and privacy are complementary, but not the same thing.

A very repeated phrase is: "It is possible to have security without privacy, but it is not possible to have privacy without security".

Privacy is a right that must be protected, and Data Protection are the measures that will be used to achieve this protection.

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#### QUESTION 5

What is the main use of a persistent cookie?

- A. To save the pages a user has bookmarked in the user's browser history
- B. To record every keystroke made by a computer user to find out passwords
- C. To ensure that the user's personal data are stored securely on the server
- D. To personalize the user's experience of the website during the next visit

Correct Answer: D

To ensure that the user's personal data are stored securely on the server. Incorrect. Cookies are not used to store data on the server.

To personalize the user's experience of the website during the next visit. Correct. This is the main purpose of a persistent cookie. (Literature: A, Chapter 8)



To record every keystroke made by a computer user to find out passwords. Incorrect. Cookies are not malicious by nature, but the mechanism can be exploited maliciously.

To save the pages a user has bookmarked in the user's browser history. Incorrect. The bookmarks and browser history are saved, but not in a cookie.

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
