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**QUESTION 1**

What does code coverage show?

- A. Scrum is a framework for developing and sustaining complex products.
- B. Each component of scrum serves a specific purpose and is essential to Scrum's success
- C. Scrum is based on empirical process control
- D. Scrum is like traditional project management, but then with project managers replaced by self-management.
- E. Scrum is a methodology based on empirical process control.

Correct Answer: D

Scrum is not a methodology, because it doesn't fill in the details, it's a framework. Next to that, it is not like traditional project management where time, cost and scope are fixed.

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**QUESTION 3**

Which are three attributes of a bad bug report?

Correct Answer: ABC

you don't want to blame anyone, have vague titles or make vague statements. It needs to be clear and constructive, and focussed on one specific problem. It should also not contain feature requests.

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#### QUESTION 4

What are the developers responsible for? (choose two)

- A. Resolving conflicts amongst the developers
- B. Selecting the product owner
- C. Organizing work required to meet the sprint goal
- D. Reporting productivity

Correct Answer: AC

They are concerned with everything that needs to happen to create a working increment. And they are self-managing, so resolving conflicts is something they should arrange as well.

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#### QUESTION 5

What are some disadvantages of code coverage as a measure for how well a system or product is tested? (three answers)

- A. It does not measure usability
