Among the choices, it is only the word "absorbing" that represents a desirable quality. So, "absorbing" is the answer.

Based on the sentence above, what is the meaning of the word cacophony?

Correct Answer: E

The parson described is said to be "often a disarming camaraderie", meaning that his friendship was not genuine, but was a pretended one. The use of the word "revenge" indicates that the person in whom he was pretending friendship was one who had harmed him earlier. So, the sentence must mean that the person described in the sentence was intent upon taking revenge for this earlier harm. He must therefore be looking for an opportunity to take revenge, even while pretending friendship. So, among the choices for the second missing word, only "preparing" and "awaiting" are appropriate. Such a clever person will obviously not be "harmless" in his vindictiveness. So, "harmless; preparing" is not a suitable choice for the first missing word. "Devious" (meaning cunning) is what describes such a person perfectly, and fits in well in the first blank. So, "devious; awaiting" is the answer.
